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## ADMISSIONS & PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

The School of Global Studies is a choice program designed for success in college and the 21<sup>st</sup> century with a curriculum that is interdisciplinary, interconnected, focused on global relationships and multi-tiered allowing all students to gain a heightened awareness of current issues facing our international community while developing their own perspective and foundation of knowledge in which to better understand the world today.

### Admission to the School of Global Studies:

Students from all attendance areas may apply.

- Complete Global Studies Application with Resume and Essay
- Complete the Terry Sanford Application packet if out of district and/or not a CCS student last year
- Complete the Cumberland County School of Choice application if applying as an out of district student. Available November 16, 2020 until January 22, 2021
- Copy of semester report card with a minimum cumulative GPA 3.0 and no subject grade lower than a “C”.
- Minimum EOC/EOG percentile in the 3 core areas (waived due to current covid situation)
- Only 9<sup>th</sup> graders being considered

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### Course Requirements

**All courses must be Honors or AP level if available**

4 English credits	1 Health/Physical Education credit

4 Science credits	1 Foundation of Knowledge (Freshman Year Only)
4 Social Studies credits	1 Humanities (Senior Year Only)
3 Foreign Language credits (one from 8 <sup>th</sup> grade & two in high school or all three in high school)	5 electives of Student Choice

#### All students will

- Complete a minimum of 10 AP and/or FTCC classes while attending Terry Sanford High School (also includes online or teleconference classes)
- 9<sup>th</sup> graders, complete Foundations of Knowledge with AP World History
- As 12<sup>th</sup> graders, complete Humanities
- Complete **volunteer service hours** yearly (9<sup>th</sup>=20 hrs; 10<sup>th</sup> =30 hrs; 11<sup>th</sup> = 40 hrs; 12<sup>th</sup> = 40 hrs)
- Actively complete 4 CFNC modules yearly as pre-requisite for remaining in Global (2 modules in fall and 2 in spring 9-11<sup>th</sup> grade) - \* completed products submitted to Global Office
- Be required to complete and submit a yearly updated school resume
- Actively participate in required Global functions each year
- Create a senior year project that will include: multi-media production, research paper and presentation to be evaluated before a panel.
- Generate a senior portfolio that showcases various writing and/or artistic pieces.
