## **Cumberland County Board of Education Regular Meeting**

The Cumberland County Board of Education (BOE) will hold its regular April 2022 monthly meeting starting immediately following the 6:00 p.m. Public Hearing regarding the proposed closure of Lillian Black Elementary & Ireland Drive Middle School on Tuesday, May 10, 2022. The meeting will be open to the public via live-streaming available on [the district's YouTube channel](#), and there will also be capacity-limited seating available to members of the public. During the meeting on May 10, 2022, citizens may share their public comments in person only. As always, each comment is limited to 3 minutes with a total of 30 minutes set aside for public comments. Individuals requesting to share public comments during the public comment period may sign up using the following link: <https://goo.gl/forms/ZGa8Q33DJMo3D9tH3>, which will be accessible starting at noon on Tuesday, May 10, 2022, and remain open until 5:30 p.m. No walk-up sign-ups will be allowed – citizens must sign up electronically in advance of the meeting before the aforementioned deadline.

## **Armstrong Elementary School to Host FIRST 'Girls on the Run 5K'**

Armstrong Elementary School teacher Stephanie Hall and two assistant coaches have been training 30 third through fifth-grade female students for a first-of-its-kind 'Girls on the Run 5K' race which will be held on Saturday, May 14, 2022, starting at 8:00 a.m. at Armstrong Elementary. This race is the culmination of a 10-week program which includes a mental health, team building and self-confidence curriculum. Twice a week, the volunteer students meet for practice, warm up and complete a running workout to get ready for the final 5k race.
