Cumberland County Schools Graduates, Coach Honored by North Carolina High School Athletic Association

*Male Athlete of Year, Homer Thompson Memorial 'Eight Who Make a
Difference' Award and a Mark Dreibelbis Scholarship*

Fayetteville, N.C. – Davis Molnar, a recent graduate of Terry Sanford High School, has been recognized as the N.C. High School Athletic Association (NCHSAA) Male Athlete of the Year for the 2021-2022 season. Molnar played both basketball and soccer and earned all-conference honors in both sports. He will be furthering his educational and athletic career in the fall of 2022 at Furman University in Greenville, S.C.

The NCHSAA's Homer Thompson Memorial 'Eight Who Make a Difference' Award has been awarded to Westover High School's basketball coach, George Stackhouse. This is bestowed upon one individual in each North Carolina region in partnership with the NC Farm Bureau Mutual Insurance Company. Stackhouse is one of eight recipients honored for their dedication to coaching and being an excellent role model for student-athletes.

The NCHSAA also recently announced Kylie Aldridge, a recent graduate of Gray's Creek High School, as one of five recipients of the 2021-2022 Mark Dreibelbis Scholarship. She received the \$2,500 scholarship award and a commemorative plaque. Aldridge is a two-sport star, breaking two county records and being named an NCHSAA Scholar-Athlete in softball and volleyball. She will continue to play softball while studying biology at Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, Va.
